Springfield Update

Competing Plans to Address Rising Gas Prices

As you know, last month <u>ACEC Illinois laid out its strong</u> opposition to Governor Pritzker's proposed plan to suspend the inflationary adjustment on the Motor Fuel Tax—a key component of the Rebuild Illinois funding structure.

Following intense lobbying by ACEC Illinois and other groups, new proposals are emerging that would protect the funding for Rebuild Illinois, but allow for levels of relief for consumers. Here are outlines of each proposal.

<u>Senate Republican Proposal</u>: Spearheaded by Senator Don DeWitte and Senator Dave Syverson, <u>the Senate Republican proposal</u>, would keep the current inflationary adjustment but would cap the state gas sales tax at 18 cents per gallon. Senate Republicans outline that Rebuild Illinois funding projections assumed sales tax around the 18 cents per gallon, indicating that their proposal would not impact road funding for at least this year.

<u>Senate Democrat Proposal</u>: Part of a larger \$1.8 billion tax relief program, the <u>Senate Democrat proposal</u> would put a 6 month suspension of the inflationary adjustment but would backfill revenue loss for those 6 months from funds from the Leaking Underground Storage Tank fund. The inflationary adjustment would be implemented January 1. Senate Democrats believe this would not impact road funding.

Overall, we are glad to see lawmakers listen and act on our concerns of suspending the

inflationary adjustment and its impact on Rebuild Illinois funding. We will keep you posted on how these proposals advance, the legislature is scheduled to adjourn this Friday.

<u>Design Build Advances to Governor's Desk</u>

Advancing with near unanimous support in both the House and Senate, <u>SB 2981</u>—legislation authorizing IDOT and Tollway to utilize alternative delivery systems, including design build, progressive design build and CMGC is now on the Governor's desk for final approval.

Below are some of the toplines on the legislation:

- Caps IDOT Design Build spend at \$400m per MYP
- Creates separate DBE goals for Design and Construction
- Protections against "bid shopping"
- Requirement for IDOT to separately procure Phase 3 services for larger projects

Procurement Reform

ACEC Illinois has been working with leadership in both the House and Senate to secure procurement law changes to allow for greater communication and knowledge transfer between consultants and agency staff. We are hopeful that some of our recommendations will be considered for a pending procurement omnibus bill. Many of the ideas developed for this package were a culmination of work done by the ACEC Illinois Business Development Committee.



Federal Update

Congress Approves IIJA Funding

In March, President Biden signed into law the \$1.5 trillion omnibus bill to fund the federal government for the rest of fiscal year 2022. The law unlocks the full 2022 increases that the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) authorized for highway and transit programs.

With the FY22 Appropriations law in place, state DOTs, transit agencies, water utilities and other client sectors now have the confidence to move forward on both short-term and long-term infrastructure projects.

ACEC Illinois met with the Illinois Congressional delegation in early-March to advocate for quick approval of this critical funding.

U.S. Dot Announces \$2.9b in IIJA Funding For Major Infrastructure Projects

The U.S. Department of Transportation today announced \$2.9 billion of funding for major infrastructure projects now available through the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA). The funding represents three major discretionary grant programs that will be combined into one Multimodal Projects Discretionary Grant opportunity.

The funding includes the National Infrastructure Project Assistance (MEGA) program, which was created in the new infrastructure law to fund major projects that are too large or complex for traditional funding programs. According to a news release from U.S. DOT, the MEGA program will provide grants on a competitive basis to support multi-jurisdictional or regional projects of significance that may also include multiple modes of transportation.

Eligible projects for the MEGA project could include highway, bridge, freight, port, passenger rail, and public transportation projects of national and regional significance. U.S. DOT says these projects, for example, could be bridges or tunnels connecting two states or new rail and transit lines that improve equity and reduce emissions. U.S. DOT will award 50% of funding to projects greater than \$500 million in cost, and 50% to projects between \$100 million and \$500 million in cost. The program will receive up to \$1 billion this year alone and be able to provide multi-year funding to projects.

Chicago Region Eyes Mega Project Funding

From <u>Crain's Chicago</u>: Local officials haven't disclosed which projects here they'll enter into the bidding. But reliable sources say local contenders could include reconstruction of North DuSable Lake Shore Drive, extension of the Chicago Transit Authority's Blue Line to Mannheim Road as part of reconstruction of the Eisenhower Expressway (I-90), completion of the partially funded 75th Street rail grade-separation project, and renovation of Union Station as well as the addition of a new Metra stop in the booming Fulton Market district.

services, significant public sector experience and an active track record of service to the community.

Lanyea Griffin, P.E. has been named as Illinois Tollway's Executive Director on an interim basis. Since 2018, Ms. Griffin has served as the Deputy Chief of Program Implementation. She joined the Illinois Tollway in 2013. Her background includes serving as Senior Civil Engineer at Jacobs, Project Engineer at Infrastructure Engineering, Inc. and as Civil Engineer at Bechtel Corporation. Ms. Griffin earned a B.S. in Civil/Environmental Engineering at Northwestern University.



QBS

The ACEC Research Institute released a new report "An Analysis of QBS in the Procurement Process," which definitively found that federal and state projects using QBS had lower project costs and better on-time delivery versus those selecting firms based on the cheapest bid.

Key findings in the report include:

- QBS saves money—Projects where QBS was used to procure engineering services experienced less cost growth (3 percent) versus the national average (6 percent).
- QBS saves time—QBS projects perform better in terms of project delivery time, experiencing less schedule growth versus the national average (7 percent with QBS versus 10 percent without).
- QBS produces higher levels of client satisfaction—89% of QBS projects received "high" or "very high" satisfaction ratings from project owners.
- QBS promotes innovation—Projects incorporating QBS have a greater likelihood of producing innovative solutions.

Baxter & Woodman Consulting Engineers

• How long have you been in the engineering industry?

• Baxter & Woodman, Inc. celebrated our 75 year anniversary last year! In the beginning, the firm focused on providing water and wastewater treatment for municipalities out of a small 2-man office located in Crystal Lake, Illinois. Today, Baxter & Woodman has a staff of over 330 team members, with clients being served out of thirteen offices throughout IL, WI, TX and FL. Over the years, the company's service offerings have expanded. Baxter & Woodman now provides planning, design, construction and technology services for water, wastewater, stormwater and transportation facilities for municipalities, counties and state agencies and more. Environmental, geographic information systems (GIS), water and wastewater operations, and advanced technology needs complement the firm's civil engineering expertise. The company has several subsidiaries including ones focused on Natural Resources, Municipal Technology, and Design-Build project delivery.

• What projects are you currently working on?

- Reconstruction of Central Tri-State Project Baxter and Woodman is currently completing a Various Bridge Rehabilitation project along the Central Tri-State (I-294) for the Illinois Tollway. We were selected in 2017 as part of the \$4B reconstruction and widening of I-294 from Balmoral Avenue to 95th Street. This project will provide congestion relief to meet current and future transportation demand and address regional transportation needs.
- IDOT District 1 Program Design Project Support- Since 2015, Baxter and Woodman

has been supporting IDOT District One Bureau of Design staff as Program Manager for Phase II projects and services. This work has included cost estimating, railroad coordination, joint agreement preparation and negotiation, technical support, utility coordination, structural design, project management, and hazardous waste screening and Preliminary Environmental Site Assessment (PESA) and Preliminary Site Investigation (PSI) reports.

City of Joliet - Water System Improvements – Since 2016, Baxter & Woodman has been assisting the City with water system capital planning, GIS assistance, and design and construction engineering to address failing water infrastructure. The firm used the City's GIS to develop a hydraulic model of the distribution system and prioritize water system needs. Approximately 25 miles of water main were replaced in the first five years. Beginning this year, the City will replace more than 20 miles annually to significantly reduce non-revenue water losses by 2030. This program will dramatically reduce water main breaks and leaks and replace lead service lines throughout the system.

What project are you most proud of?

- McHenry County Division of Transportation Randall Road Improvements
- Spanning one-and-a-half miles, this project encompassed the critical intersection of Randall and Algonquin Roads, a central crossroad for east-west travel. From the start, the project focused on improving traffic flow along the corridor, which bears one of the highest traffic volumes in the region, and increasing the intersection's level of service. The improvements upgraded the roadway to the latest access standards, utilized efficient lighting and signals, increased pedestrian safety and access, helped reduce accidents by providing protected turn lanes, and improved traffic flow by adding capacity.
- First-of-its-kind triple left turn lanes were added on both legs of the intersection to manage turning movements onto Randall Road. An underpass was constructed beneath Randall Road to provide pedestrian and bicycle connectivity between neighborhoods, commercial areas, and Jacobs High School. Baxter & Woodman was part of the Phase I Design Team and served as the Phase III Construction Engineer. This project was awarded the ACEC-IL 2022 Engineering Excellence Honor Award and the APWA 2022 Chicago Metro Chapter Project of the Year Transportation 25M 75M and the APWA 2022 Chicago Metro Chapter Public Works Project Excellence Award.

What has been the biggest benefit of you joining ACEC-IL?

• One of the benefits of joining ACEC-IL has been strategic partnering. By connecting with other firms with like-minded interests we have increased our teaming opportunities. These strategic partnerships result in a stronger project team, allowing us to win more work and provide more comprehensive services for our clients.
