Deadline Nears for IIJA "Mega Project" Grant Submittals

We may know this month if the I-290 Corridor is on the fast-track to repair and modernization.

The U.S. Department of Transportation announced \$2.9 billion of funding for major infrastructure projects now available through the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA). The deadline for applications is May 23rd.

The funding represents three major discretionary grant programs that will be combined into one Multimodal Projects Discretionary Grant opportunity.

The funding includes the National Infrastructure Project Assistance (MEGA) program, which was created in the new infrastructure law to fund major projects that are too large or complex for traditional funding programs. According to a news release from U.S. DOT, the MEGA program will provide grants on a competitive basis to support multi-jurisdictional or regional projects of significance that may also include multiple modes of transportation.


Eligible projects for the MEGA project could include highway, bridge, freight, port, passenger rail, and public transportation projects of national and regional significance. U.S. DOT says these projects, for example, could be bridges or tunnels connecting two states or new rail and transit lines that improve equity and reduce emissions. U.S. DOT will award 50% of funding to projects greater than \$500 million in cost, and 50% to projects between \$100 million and \$500 million in cost. The program will receive up to \$1 billion this year alone and be able to provide multi-year funding to projects.

The other programs included in this grant opportunity include the Infrastructure for Rebuilding America (INFRA) program and the Rural Surface Transportation Grant Program (RURAL).

INFRA is an existing competitive program that will see a more than 50% increase in this year's funding due to the IIJA. The new infrastructure law provides approximately \$8 billion for INFRA over 5 years, of which approximately \$1.55 billion will be made available through this round of funding.

It is expected that efforts to repair and modernized the I-290 corridor would necessitate funding from potentially both Mega and Infra grants.

Governor Signs Budget Deal that Protects Infrastructure Funding

During the waning days of this Spring's legislative session, the House and Senate approved a measure to suspend the inflationary adjustment on the gas tax until January 1, 2023. In order to keep funding on target, any projected loss of funds due to the delay in the inflationary adjustment will be provided by the LUST Fund (Leaking Underground Storage Tank). In short, there should be no

fiscal impact to the road fund and the inflationary adjustment will continue to be compounded on schedule.

Here are more details:


- Deposits all proceeds (1.1 cents per gallon) from the Leaking Underground Storage Tank Fund for the fiscal year July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, into the Transportation Renewal Fund:
- Includes language requiring gas stations to post notice of the tax freeze; and
- Includes language clarifying that the index increase will again take effect July 1, 2023.

ACEC Illinois issued a <u>statement in support of this compromise package</u> and thanked the legislators for finding a solution that continues to keep our promise to repair Illinois' infrastructure. As you know, <u>ACEC Illinois came out early in opposition</u> to the initial plan of completely suspending the inflationary adjustment for the gas tax and offered and supported compromises that kept funding whole for Rebuild Illinois and kept the CPI provision in place.

ACEC Illinois appreciates the efforts of the legislature and Governor Pritzker to find a resolution that protects infrastructure funding.

Motor Fuel Tax Remains Within the Margins of Projections in April

Motor Fuel Tax



The combined April revenue (both Motor Fuel Tax Fund and Transportation Renewal Fund) was \$204.7 million. On a dollar basis, this represents a \$97.8 million dollar increase over the pre-Rebuild Illinois average (FY 16 - FY 19). This represents a (5.9%) DECREASE in consumption when compared to the same pre-Rebuild Illinois period.

ACEC Addresses Supply Chain Challenges

ACEC joined with ARTBA and AGC requesting USDOT Secretary Pete Buttigieg to prioritize projects that seek to ease supply chain problems in the recently announced availability of nearly \$4 billion in discretionary funds

The letter attracted broad support from many organizations, including the US Chamber, the National Association of Manufacturers, the American Trucking Association and many others. There will be additional action items going forward as we work with these partners and others, but this initial joint effort is particularly timely right now given the state of the economy.

ASCE Illinois Infrastructure Report Card Released



The Illinois Section of the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE) today revealed its 2022 Infrastructure Report Card, giving the state an overall grade of C-. Illinois' civil engineers studied eleven infrastructure categories. Of those eleven, six categories are in mediocre condition, and five categories are in poor condition.


